Kenya Mission Trip - Want to participate in the Kenya Mission without leaving Sponsor a clean water filtration bucket for \$30. It will provide clean water for a family for up to 10 years. The filtration systems are purchased through RipplAffect and are geo tagged, so once we've handed them out in June 2026, you'll be able to see a photo of the family who received it, and track their location on the website's map.

Wyler Family Update - Since 2021 the Fletcher Church has provided financial support to the Wylers, a missionary family serving with Adventist Frontier Missions in a creative access country. Thank you to the many of you who gave generously to the Fletcher Mission Fund and the Wyler Fund these past several years. Our missionaries shared the light of Jesus with many people under difficult circumstances. A few months ago the Wylers came home to the USA on permanent return and their project has been closed down. Because of this the option to give to the Wyler project through AdventistGiving has been discontinued. If you contributed to the Wyler Fund in the past please consider reallocating your mission offering to the Fletcher Mission Fund going forward. The Mission Fund is used to support various mission projects at home and abroad. This year during the month of December (and continuing through January 2026) the offerings given to the Fletcher Mission Fund will be used to support and expand the work of our own Community Services and Thrift Store ministry.

A New Way of Thinking - This year your pastors and elders spent time reflecting on what God is calling us to be and do as leaders. We recognized the need for a new way of thinking about ourselves and our church. As your leaders, we are not simply the elders and pastors of this church, but of the cities of Hendersonville and Fletcher. Each member of the Fletcher Church is invited into this new way of thinking and living. We are not a church that exists to serve only ourselves, but to serve the communities in which we live. We want to think of the people around us as part of our community and part of our church family even if they aren't formal members of the Adventist Church. In alignment with this new way of thinking, the church board voted on November 18 to merge the Benevolent Fund and the Emergency Assistance Fund into one fund that will be called the Benevolent Fund. These two funds were set up years ago with good intentions - one fund to serve church members and the other fund to serve non-members. But we aren't going to make a distinction any longer based on church membership. The fund will exist to help anyone in need. The fund will continue to be administered as it has in the past. A small and confidential committee considers requests for financial assistance and provides help with a goal of sustainable empowerment. If you know of someone who is in need of financial assistance, please contact one of the pastors. You may give to the Benevolent Fund online or by marking an offering envelope accordingly. It is also our practice to collect an offering for the Benevolent Fund at the end of each communion service. Our next communion service will be January 10, 2026.



END-OF-YEAR MISSION PROJECT - Every December the Fletcher Church adopts a mission project or several projects both local and across the world. In the past we have supported local ministries like the Asheville Dream Center and Open Arms Pregnancy Center in Hendersonville as well as a Clean Water Project in Kenya and the Wyler Family, a missionary family sharing Jesus in a hard-to-reach context overseas. This year our mission project is our very own Community Services and Thrift Store. This ministry of the Fletcher Church had been operating for decades out of an old dormitory on the Fletcher Academy campus, but this summer we were able to purchase a new building at 2231 Howard Gap Rd. The center provides free food, low-cost clothing and home goods to hundreds of people each month. Dozens of people who walk through the doors of the center are able to pray with one of our volunteers. They consider the center to be their "church." We aim to expand the hours of operation, further improve the facility, and expand the ministry offerings. COMMUNITY OUTREACH BY THE FLETCHER SEVENTH-DAY ADVENTIST CHURCH

Many church members are actively involved in serving their community. They do it freely, generously, without making known what they do. But we hear about some of what is done in the name of Christ, and we give thanks to God for this effective ministry.

Below is a list of some of the organized and known activities that serve the needs of people in our community and beyond. If you would like to get involved in helping with one or more of these ministries, please contact a pastor or one of the ministry leaders.

- 1. The **Thrift Store**, a ministry of Fletcher Church, is staffed by volunteers from our church community and beyond. It provides clothing, furniture, and household items to the public. Often the store assists people who face hard times by donating materials.
- 2. The **Fletcher Christian Counseling Center** is a ministry of the Fletcher Church and provides Christ-centered mental health services. We currently employ five therapists who meet with clients throughout the week.
- 3. We partner with other Seventh-day Adventist Churches to support our schools **Fletcher Academy** and **Captain Gilmer Christian School**. Members of our congregation work and volunteer at the schools and provide scholarship funds for children from the community as well as for members of our church family.
- 4. Programs on **Mental and Physical Health, Divorce Recovery, and Depression Management** attract people from the community. The programs run for several weeks at a time and occur throughout the year.
- 5. **Bible Presentations** are held each year to serve those who respond to our invitations with opportunities to know God, the Gospel of Jesus Christ and life in the Spirit.
- 6. Our church facility is a venue for weekly meetings held by **Alcoholics Anonymous** and **Narcotics Anonymous**. Such organizations often have difficulty being accommodated by churches. We are happy to open our doors to these recovery support groups.
- 7. Each year up to 70 children attend the **Foster Children's Christmas Party** which is put on by our church. Henderson County Social Services partners with us to select the families. Our church members purchase gifts for the children and provide food and funds to shower the kids with love.
- 8. Children and youth from the community are sponsored each summer to attend age-appropriate **Summer Camp** at NOSOCA Pines Ranch in South Carolina.
- 9. We partner with the Lelia Patterson Center on Sunday mornings for an **Adult Men's Basketball Ministry** starting at 9am. Please contact Jacob Stout at 573-303-1969 for more information.
- 10. A faithful team of volunteers from our church serves lunch every Sunday to the homeless at the **Hendersonville Rescue Mission.**
- 11. Our congregation supports the **Interfaith Assistance Ministry** organization with funds and volunteer help. This organization has skilled personnel who assist needy people in Henderson County with food, clothing, rent assistance, and utility payments.
- 12. Agencies such as **Safelight, Free Clinics**, and **Open Arms Pregnancy Center** in Hendersonville are supported by members of our church who provide volunteer help.
